## Grant Announcement Summary

**Program Area:** Homeland Security

**Grant Title:** HS Mutual Aid Radio Replacement: Round 5 (2007 & 2008)

**Description:** The purpose of this program is to ensure that radios used by emergency response agencies have the ability to access common or shared mutual aid frequencies during an emergency or crisis. Funding is available for those agencies that have submitted pre-applications for the purpose of replacing outdated fixed, portable and mobile radios only. Agencies meeting additional qualifications are also eligible to replace **one** portable with a multi-band portable radio.

**Opportunity Category:** Competitive (Limited Eligibility based on Pre-Application Process)

**Important Dates:**

- **October 1, 2009:** Deadline for local agency to communicate their equipment needs to the county EM Director for a consolidated county application.
- **October 29, 2009:** Deadline for county or state agency or tribal government to submit online applications for all equipment.
- **December 1, 2009:** Project Start Date
- **February 26, 2010:** Project End Date

**Anticipated Funding Amount:** Approximately \$5.7 million has been allocated for interoperability improvement under this round. Funds are available through the 2007 and 2008 State Homeland Security Grant.

**Match/Cost Sharing Requirement:** While there is no match requirement, awarded funds will cover up to 75% of the total cost of the equipment, up to a maximum amount depending on the type of equipment. The sub-grantee is responsible for paying the remaining cost of the equipment.

**Eligibility:** County emergency management offices are eligible to submit a combined application for all agencies in a county. Funding will be provided only for those agencies that previously submitted a pre-application for the 5<sup>th</sup> round of mutual aid radio replacement and were approved as described in Attachment 1 of this announcement.

Local agencies should not submit applications directly to OJA. Local agencies included on the list of eligible sub-grantees should coordinate with County EM Directors who will submit a combined county application through OJA Egrants. It is important that county emergency management directors are aware of all funding that is awarded to local agencies. County EM Directors needing information regarding local pre-application requests from their county should contact OJA for more information.

**Eligible Expenses:** Allowable expenses include costs related to mutual aid channel enhancement via replacement of outdated radios. Detailed information on eligible expenses is provided in the full announcement.

All expenses must be new and cannot replace existing state or local government funding. Equipment purchases or administrative/personnel costs previously planned in the agency's budget may not be included in this program. Substitution of existing funds with federal grants (supplanting) will be the subject of monitoring and audit. Violations may result in a range of penalties, including suspension of current and future funds under this program, suspension or debarment from federal grants, repayment of monies provided under a grant, and civil and/or criminal penalties. ## HS Mutual Aid Radio Replacement: Round 5 (2007 & 2008)

The Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) provides financial and technical assistance to public safety, first response and emergency management agencies throughout the state. As the State Administering Agency for state and federal criminal justice and homeland security grant funds, OJA is responsible for establishing funding priorities, developing application criteria, awarding and disseminating grants, and assessing project achievements. This grant announcement provides information about a specific grant opportunity and instructions to help those eligible apply for a share of the available funds.

### Program Description

One of Wisconsin's top priorities is to resolve existing communications interoperability issues and improve voice communications among emergency response agencies and disciplines throughout the state. Through this grant opportunity, we will move closer to achieving the short-term goal of ensuring that all public safety agencies in the state have access to common mutual aid channels.

The purpose of these funds is to replace portable, fixed or mobile radios that have fewer than 17 channels and cannot be reprogrammed to include 10 mutual aid channels. A pre-application process was completed earlier this year and agencies currently eligible for these funds were selected through that process. The list of agencies, by county, and the number and type of radios approved for funding can be found at the end of this announcement.

### Award Information

A total of \$5.7 million is available. Grant funds will cover up to 75% of the total replacement or upgrade cost, up to a maximum amount depending on the type of equipment. The sub-grantee is responsible for paying the remaining cost of the equipment. **This is not a match requirement**, rather a requirement for a funding commitment on the part of the grantee. While there is no restriction on what local funding source is used to fulfill this commitment, applicants may NOT use funds awarded through the homeland security grant program.

Upon application approval, the applicant agency's project director will receive a paper grant award document by mail in approximately 30 days.

### Submit Applications Using Egrants

Applications must be submitted through the OJA Egrants online grants management system. If you have never used OJA Egrants before, you will need to register for access to the system. To register online, go to <http://register.wisconsin.gov/AccountManagement/> and complete the 'self registration' process. On the account registration site, you will have a choice between the OJA Egrants and Commerce eGrants. Please take care to select **OJA Egrants** during this process.

Authorization to access Egrants can take several days depending on registration activity. The OJA help desk is open Monday-Friday 8am-4:30pm if you need assistance. (Please note: If you register outside of these hours, access may not be approved until the next business day.) Once your Egrants access has been approved, you may begin your online grant application.

## Eligible Expenses

Please keep the following requirements in mind:

1. Radio Replacement Criteria

Within the quantity in the attached table, radios with fewer than 17 channels that cannot be reprogrammed to include 10 mutual aid channels are eligible for replacement. In some cases, radios that have more channels may be replaced if they are not software re-programmable. UHF radios must be replaced with VHF radios.

2. New Radio Requirements

- Compliant with Phase 1, P25 standards
- Upgradeable to P25 trunking
- Provide 48 channel minimum capacity
- Capable of Alphanumeric Display
- 138-174 MHz band spread
- VHF and 700/800MHz band spread - for agencies allowed the one multi-band mobile radio
- Programmed according to Statewide Mutual Aid Frequency Plan within the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan (available for download on the Interoperability website at <http://ic.wi.gov>) with a minimum of 20 statewide mutual aid channels.

Any regular maintenance and/or calibration required to ensure the accuracy and dependability of the requested equipment must be completed in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations and specifications.

3. Maximum Reimbursements Available

Grant funds will be reimbursed to cover 75% of the purchase cost of approved equipment up to a maximum amount based on type of radio. (See table below) Purchase cost includes the radio, battery, accessories 1 year maintenance and installation.

<u>Type of Radio</u>	<u>Maximum Reimbursement</u>
Portable Radios	\$1,000
Fixed and/or Mobile Radios (including dual control head radios)	\$2,000
Multi-band Portable Radios	\$3,500

Example 1: An agency purchases a portable radio for \$1,200; the reimbursable amount is 75% of the cost: \$900.

Example 2: An agency purchases a portable radio for \$1,800; although the 75% amount is \$1,350, the reimbursable amount is the maximum for this type of equipment: \$1,000.

4. Equipment requests should be based on need and fit within the jurisdiction's preparedness plan as well as the Statewide Communication Interoperability Plan. Equipment under this grant should be deployed consistent with current mutual aid agreements in the jurisdiction. Agencies can also replace one eligible portable with a multi-band portable radio. Multi-band Portable Radios may only be purchased by an agency that uses a VHF band voice radio system for their agency primary operations and who reasonably anticipate mutual aid response with another agency that operates using a VHF or 700/800 MHz system. A jurisdiction that intends to apply for a multi-band radio will list this item separately from other equipment items. Each multi-band radio per qualifying agency will have its own entry on the application. Full narrative justification explaining the local need for a multi-band capability will be required. Please indicate how your organization will encounter mutual aid operations with an agency that operates on another band.

5. P25 Compliance

**All communications equipment purchased through this grant must be compliant with the ANSI/TIA/EIAA-102 Phase 1 (Project 25 or P25) suite of standards.** To ensure that public safety first responders can communicate effectively in times of emergency, this requirement applies to all government owned or leased land mobile public safety radio equipment purchased with grant funds administered by OJA.

This policy does not apply to commercial services that offer other types of interoperability solutions and does not exclude any application if it demonstrates that the supplemental equipment being proposed will lead to enhanced interoperability in the short term. These standards have been developed to allow for backward compatibility with existing digital and analog systems and to provide for interoperability in future systems.

6. Equipment Training

Agencies that receive funding for radio replacement are required to deliver training to users on proper mutual aid channel usage and full-functionality of the radio equipment purchased under this program. **Grant funds for training may not be requested for this purpose.** Where applicable training must incorporate and follow the standards established by the National Incident Management System (NIMS), including the use of plain talk.

All personnel who utilize equipment purchased with this grant must receive training either through the vendor or other competent source specific to that piece of equipment. Training must comply with the standards identified under 29 CFR 1910.120, as applicable.

7. Restrictions

Grant funds awarded under this program **may not** be used for the following:

- General-use computers and software, except as allowed under M&A costs
- General-use vehicles
- Licensing fees
- Weapon systems & ammunition
- Construction or renovation, except when it is a necessary component of a security system
- Hiring of public safety personnel for the purposes of fulfilling traditional public safety duties
- Equipment or activities unrelated to the implementation of the grant program and the State Homeland Security Strategy
- Items not in accordance with the authorized equipment list
- Items otherwise budgeted for with local funds

8. Statewide Incidence Response Availability

All equipment purchased under this grant must be made available to other emergency response agencies statewide, as may be required for incident response purposes.

9. Property Disposal or Transfer

Equipment shall be maintained and available for use as intended by the grant for the duration of its useful life. Disposal of equipment must follow all applicable state, federal, and local guidelines. The grantee must maintain records of any equipment disposal or transfer of ownership. Any proceeds from the sale of equipment at or near the end of its useful life will be considered program revenue and must be reinvested into eligible homeland security expenses. Equipment must remain in use by the requesting agency during its useful life. Any transfer of ownership requires written notification to the OJA Interoperability Coordinator.

Equipment: Homeland Security equipment grants require that all equipment (regardless the cost) be entered in this category so that applicants can select from authorized equipment lists. Equipment is defined as items used for prevention, emergency response, and recovery operations. Other (M&A): To compensate for additional administrative costs to County EM Directors as a result of the above changes, counties can apply for an additional 3.0% of their total requested amount to cover additional administrative costs. Administrative costs may include:

- Staffing costs
- Travel and meeting related expenses (at State of Wisconsin rates)
- Authorized office equipment and supplies
- Recurring expenses such as those associated with cell phones and faxes during the period of performance which ends February 26, 2010.
- Leasing or renting of space for newly hired personnel during the period of performance

Personnel labor costs for salaried employees are not eligible for reimbursement due to the supplanting prohibition.

#### **5. Budget Narrative**

#### **Application Review and Award Criteria**

All applications must be submitted on or before the deadline identified in this grant announcement. Applications will be screened for completeness and compliance with the instructions provided in this grant announcements. Applications may be returned as necessary for corrections. Funding preference will be given based on the following:

- Priority will be given to agencies that have received less funding in prior rounds
- At least 50 percent of the available funding will be directed towards law enforcement agencies to meet national Homeland Security program guidelines
- The replacement of mobile radios will be prioritized over the replacement of portable radios to leverage the Wisconsin Interoperable System for Communications (WISCOM) system. This system will provide 95% mobile coverage in the state.
- Priority will be given to fire, law enforcement and EMS agencies using existing VHF radio systems, applications from higher risk jurisdictions and jurisdictions that have demonstrated a coordinated multi-county approach to interoperability.
- Priority will be given to agencies with a local strategy/plan for implementing the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan and a commitment to integration with the WISCOM system.

Past performance in previous grant management will influence funding decisions.

- Those agencies that returned (unused) 40% of grant award funds in prior homeland security grant programs will be considered after agencies that make effective use of prior awards.

- Those agencies that did not comply with past grant requirements or failed to close prior homeland security grant awards by the grant deadline will be considered after agencies that made the deadline initially established in the grant award letter.

County Emergency Managers will be notified regarding application status: e.g. whether the application has been tentatively approved, denied or whether an amendment is required.

A signed award document will be mailed within 30 days of notification, and until that time the grant is subject to re-allocation.

### **Post-Award Special Conditions/Reporting Requirements**

If you are awarded funds under this announcement, you will be required to provide regular progress reports. The schedule for your reports will be included in your grant award materials. At that time, please review all of your grant award special conditions and Egrants reporting requirements.
